BLM gave Enerplus around 6 permit waiting. XTO has 3 ROW's and modifications at the BIA. XTO also has an extension for about 25 wells which was submitted in September. Crestwood has 2 in Aberdeen. Buin has 3. Rimrock has 3. Marathon has 2 pending and 1 ready for submission. McKenzie probably has 5 or 6 in there. Getting temporary water lines are going to be an issue if they haven't gotten in their paperwork yet. John Fredericks states we would have to contact BIA office, they have an emergency staff to get approvals. Councilman Randy Phelan would like to see a Rig Friendly meeting in February.

John Fredericks states we circulated a draft letter for a bill that has been introduced about fee land. If the ND Petroleum Council is ready to support us that would be great. XTO stated they haven't heard from their bosses if they are.

## C. BIA Road Task Force Reassignment

## E. Setback Discussion

Would like to leave it up for open discussion. Set back hand out given to the Committee. Would like to work on some of these. We want our water safe from spills. There are 3 resolutions that have to do with setbacks. 1854 mark is the high water mark that is used to do the ½ mile set back mark. John asked about the prior wells build before the ½ mile was in place. There are 7 oil pads approved prior to the resolution since 2012 enactment of the resolution. We have around 300 will pads on the reservation right now. There is an issue with the rods breaking if you don't have multiple pads according to Enerplus. 26 well pads within a 1,000 feet, and 7 well pads.

*Motion:* Councilwoman Monica moved to bring report to TBC on amending resolution 17-038-FWF. Councilwoman V. Judy Brugh seconded the motion. Vote: 4-0-0. Motion carried.

*Discussion:* 17-037-FWF is the ¼ mile set back resolution. Any dwelling setbacks. Some tribal members are asking if they own the mineral rights and someone puts a house up this could keep them from royalties. On page 3 we are seeing some issues here, BIA is not recognizing our set back regulations.

## F. Road Scales – Richard Hall

There are 2 scales located by Mandaree. We need to finish up on them, still have easements on them. Councilman Randy Phelan states we have updated easements. There is damage being done to the road by BIA 14 from the trucks. We are thinking of putting another one up to keep BIA 14 from being damaged. Would like to have a regular office that runs 24 hours a day. Would like a land line and cameras by the weight station. Asking the Committee to move ahead with this project of the weight station by BIA 14. It depends on the budget along with the BIA shutdown.

## G. Vantage

Carson Hood Jr. would like to discuss before Vantage joins the meeting. John Fredericks states if they get a drilling plan in place before. Councilman Randy Phelan mentioned companies wash and sell, basically flipping. John states we should be able to put a tax in place. Lose On lease hold of sale. John will look into it. If we do it quick enough we can get it done on this transaction. Development program drill plan discussion, Carson Hood Jr. states Vantage didn't have any plans within the structure of their proposal. On 4 QEP's IMDA's how are they going to develop it, they never had any development in place. I don't think there is a plan within their plan they submitted. I'm concerned if this thing happens they may sit on it like QEP sat on it in the past and didn't develop those resources. Have everything handed over to Carson Hood Jr. before the next TBC.

Vantage representatives Roger and Gabe spoke on the Vantage business plan. Carson Hood Jr. mentioned Steve Gunderson's concerns on the investment with them. Steve Gunderson joined the meeting via conference call. Spoke about 10 year plan on page 5 and 6. Committee states, we have a number of concerns.

*Motion:* Councilman Fred Fox moved to forward to TBC. Councilwoman Monica Mayer seconded the motion. Vote: 4-0-0. Motion carried.

*Discussion:* John would encourage an advance of the drilling plan before the next meeting.

Carson Hood Jr. and Shenan R. Atcitty. Carson Hood Jr. stated he brought the contracts forth before the committee level and TBC would like to resubmit Shenan R. Atcitty's contract to Committee level again for consideration. Shenan R. Atcitty's contract is more than TAT's in house attorney contract. Councilman Randy Phelan mentioned every department took a cut. Contract is 250 committee suggested 125. Agreed 175 by both parties.
