Hello Elders, Community Members and Relatives,

We've had a really tough month with all the relatives and family members we have lost in January. I would like to send my condolences to those families that have lost their loved ones this past month. Our prayers are with you and all our relatives. It's hard to see families in mourning, but we all have to go through this pain as it is apart of life. My heart goes out to the families as your journey begins to move forward with out our loved ones. One thing we know is that they will be in a better place and we will see them again soon.

The most important topic for discussion is the Omicron Covid Variant. It has swept through the reservation and our community rapidly. Our only defense to protect our community and ourselves is the vaccine booster, masks, social distancing and sanitizing of the hands. The school has shut down for the week and returned to distance learning. They also limited the fan base for home games. Also, all the Tribal Buildings in White Shield, such as the community center, complex, store, administration building, and elder center require masks before entering. We must follow the Covid protocol guidelines as we continue our daily lives in the community. The influenza virus is also at a high, so we must take additional precautions. So please be careful and always protect your family.

The MHA Nation has moved to another Health Insurance for all Tribal members. So far, close to 6,000 members have been transferred from Boon's Health Insurance to Sanford Health Insurance. Tribal members have already been sent their Health, Dental and Vision Card in the mail, if a person hasn't please call Charity Yesslith at (701)421-0915 or Red Fox Sanchez at (701)421-8393. This is an excellent benefit for all off-reservation Tribal Members. From my understanding we are the only Federally Recognized Tribe that offers Health Insurance to all Tribal members.

The Tribal Business Council has been working diligently on several projects to better the Reservation's services and also develop economic growth and infrastructure for each community. I would like to thank each and every Council member for their support for each other on developing our Tribal communities. In each segment, we are building new Community buildings that will benefit each tribal member for fitness, games, and social gatherings. Other projects include Youth Centers, Emergency Management Center, Clinics, diabetes center, KDU, Schools, Housing, Green houses, Renewable energy projects, Sober living homes, Tribal Head quarter building, and Veteran buildings.

I would like to congratulate the White Shield Varsity Girls basketball team as they wrap up their season. They had a very tough season as they were very young but they played their hearts out every single game. They knew they were going to have a up hill battle, but I want them to keep their heads up high as they represented our school very proudly. I also want to to thank the fans for cheering them on every night at the games. February 10th, 11th, and 12th, will be hosting the District 15 Girls Basketball tournament the White Shield School. This will be White Shield School's second time in school history where we will be hosting a District basketball tournament. The last time was three years ago for the boys. So we are very proud hosting District tournaments here at home in the White Shield. Please come out and support your team and community.



The boys basketball team won't wrap up their season until the end of February, so let's get out and support their team. I believe we have the most talented team in the District, if not the Region. We just need our boys to come together as a team and they will be very hard to beat.

Public Health Notice

Issued Friday, January 21, 2022

The Ft. Berthold Reservation is currently experiencing a CRITICAL INCREASE in COVID-19 cases.

The weekly EOC/Covid-19 Task Force Thursday Rapid Testing Event held in New Town yesterday yielded 35 Active Positives out of 203 submitted test samples.

This resulted in a new positivity rate record of 17.24%.

This is the highest positivity rate seen since the start of the Pandemic in March 2020.

At this present time, a total of 231 Active Positive Cases are reported on the Ft. Berthold Reservation. This is also a new record on FBI for active positive cases since the start of the Pandemic in March 2020.

This illustrates that Covid-19 is still a very present threat to the health and safety of the public, especially our Elders, youth, and those who are immune-compromised. It is strongly recommended everyone eligible for the vaccine to get these Covid-19 immunization doses with the booster dose. In addition, everyone is encouraged to get Covid-19 rapid tested weekly even after being vaccinated.





While it is rare, fully vaccinated individuals can still be carriers of the virus and spread it to others. This is why regular rapid testing is recommended.

Rest assured, the Covid-19 Task Force, EOC, and EMHC are diligently working to continue to provide emergency aid services to those affected. We are seeing a substantial increase in requests for these services over the past 30 days. Our Distribution Aid Center (DAC) and Isolation Care Center (IC) teams are hard at work continuing to meet those needs of assistance.

Please remember, fully vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals should continue to take precautions by continuing to wear a well-fitted face mask, practicing frequent hand washing/hand sanitizing, and also disinfecting work and living areas frequently.

Honoring the Life of Richard Everett Hosie

Richard Everett Hosie passed away Monday, January 17, 2022, unexpectedly. He was 75 years old. He was a beloved father, brother, uncle, grandfather.

Richard was born October 6, 1946 in Elbowoods, North Dakota to Pliga Youngbird and Everett "Sparky" Hosie. He was the eldest of nine children. He was delivered by Dr. Herbert Wilson; something he liked to point out. In his early years he was raised by his beloved grandmother, Lottie Styles Hosie. He was sent to Stephan Indian School at the age of 7 in the 2nd grade where he attended until his junior year.

During the summers he would return to White Shield where he worked on local farms/ranches. He had many escapades with his uncles, aunties and cousins, especially the Dickens and Yellow Birds. He graduated from the White Shield School in 1964. Richard was a great athlete. He joined the army becoming a paratrooper after high school. He was a Vietnam Veteran, something he didn't like to be known for. He attended vocational school in Aberdeen SD, where he met Della Thunderhawk whom he later married.

In this unity they had 6 children. Richard had exceptional work ethics. He worked as a telephone lineman/installer, in road/building construction. He worked at the Wahpeton Indian School for 30 years. While working at Wahpeton he was a friend to everyone; even caring for students that were not able to go home during the holidays/summers.

Richard always had a smile and an open door for anyone who was in need of a home. Throughout his life he met, made, and cherished many friends, whom he often thought of as family. He had adopted his brother from another mother, David Keene. He was very lost when he passed.

He retired to help his mom Pliga Youngbird-Bordeaux. After she passed, he focused on spending time with his family. He especially loved spending time with his grandchildren and was very proud of each one of them. He encouraged them to read, research history, have their own opinion, and to back that with facts; always supporting them in all their activities. He was well-versed in all of them; rodeo, football, basketball, volleyball, track-cross country, horse riding, Indian relay, horseshoes and golf.

Richard loved baseball; his favorite team was the Minnesota Twins; even taking his grandchildren to attend games on a fun bus.

He helped raise his brothers, sisters, nieces and nephews. He thought family was the most important thing. Richard was an avid hunter, fisherman and outdoorsman; teaching what he knew to his son(s) and grandchildren. He won many horseshoe tournament championships in North Dakota and Minnesota. He played in basketball leagues in Fargo, Wahpeton, winning a championship.

Richard was a generous person despite impressions; he would help anyone in need. He had a sarcastic sense of humor. He loved his family fiercely, although he was not easily affectionate.

He delighted in giving his family a hard time in teasing and enjoyed visiting family and friends. He shared many memories of friends and family, stories of his youth with us. He gave us all advice on many things. We will miss the unconditional time he had for each of us.

One thing he always said was "on time is late... 15 minutes early is on time." He didn't like being late to any appointments, work, or meetings.
