Teaching Staff (98): 48 Non-Indian (49%), 1 0 American Indian (10%), 40 Other Minority (41%). Administrative Staff (9): 8 Non-Indian (89%), 1 American Indian (11%). Hiring Staff (All Teaching Positions Filled). Teacher/Administrator Evaluations for First Semester Completed. First Semester Completed on December 18th (Distance Learning for Most Students: Special Education Students/NTHS Alternative Program Students began on October 13th). After School Face to Face and Virtual Tutoring Completed on December 21st for First Semester (Began on October 13th).

COVID request with students missing school, figuring out how to change it. Feb 14th is the day the come back to school. Trying to figure out staff training for on line learning. January 13th is the training. Attendance rates are in the low 70% area. Council will put out a message to the families how important school is. Retention Officer will go out and some families have internet, some do correspondence and even that is not working well. Not everyone is different in learning, some are falling behind, they need to be back in school. 4-18 staff will be tested for COVID. There was resolution from 2015 for attendance at school. New Town has Truancy officers that reach out to students and parents. Councilwoman Monica Mayer suggested having parents volunteer to call students and parents. Credits can be completed during off hours of school. Could offer incentives to have a better turnout. Reward for the 4.0 students.
