B. Bureau of Land Management (BLM) – Loren Wickstrom, Field Manager Update

For the month of February they have received ten APD's but in the written report they mistakenly put down five. Whole calander year 16 apds. 25 pending APD's. WPX Energy Willistion, LLC Proposed Pennington Pad – Section 8, T. 152N., R, 92 W. WPX anticipates drilling them wells in November of 2022. Mr. Wickstrom stated he is bringing it to the committee's attention because it is in the vicinity of an occupied residence but it is in accordance with the Tribal Resolution which states that you can't have a pad within a quarter of a mile of an occupied residence.Councilwoman Monica Mayer asked why BIA fails to provide an assignment for a year. The BIA has not approved these assignments, it falls on them now. Have been trying to get Rick Clifford or Lonnie Wright on conference call to answer some questions the Committee has. This will not go to March TBC, still working on it before requesting to forward to TBC.

Councilman Fred Fox states, Indian Energy needs to set up a meeting with BIA. Oil is at \$108 per barrel. 23 rigs in the state, 5 on Ft. Berthold. Two are Enerplus, one for RimRock, one for Slawson and one for Devon. Need a crdit card machine for ROW application fees, Councilwoman Monica Mayer suggests to go to work with the CFO.

Josh was at an industry meeting, mentioned working on capturing carbon would like to be carbon neutral by 2030. Jim construction forman for Enerplus is working on roads, BIA 4, 14, 17, 27 & 30 Roads. Some of the roads are paved and some are still gravel. With the Maintainance agreement they will Spot gravel, dust abatement & residence excavating. CEO will meet with Enerplus and the Roads department to work on the roads/projects. CEO will make sure Gary with Roads Department attends NRC or Energy Committee meetings. Kenny will set up a roads meeting. BIA Rick Clifford on Conference call, They have a request for a well with lack of production. There is a set amendment for a IMDA lease. 49001 lease agreement. He sent to regional office and needs approval on it yet. They have the discriptions but cannot create the tracts yet. Tom Burr joinded the conference call, they are dealing with McKenzie Electric ROW's currently. Working on lease assignments and getting those out. Harriet asked about pending and approved APD's so far, Tom states he will have to get it emailed to Harriet. Devon Energy Brandon Harrison, states theres are a number of utility assignments, have generators going on for the past year, any update on those yet. Waiting since 2019 on assignments. 13 assignments are being worked on currently, according to Tom and Rick. Councilman Fred Fox asked Tom and Rick to do an update every Energy Committee. Councilwoman Monica Mayer states, BIA needs to expedite. Councilman Fred Fox asked about probates, Rick Clifford states they are attending training and working with a new system, they are working on it. Some BIA officers are starting to work in the office, still need approval to open doors, and will notify the Tribe when they are working out of offices again.
