1) Update

Would like to set up in the first of October. I&E no more questions. Responding to public comments an dreponding to new alternative proposed. The comments and considerations will be worked on. Slawson APD's, shown on map (Teapot Federal Map). The pad would be expaned. Pad is 6 acres and slawson will put in a chain link fence. There are no wildlife or cultural concerns regarding the APD's. Lease sales, Councilman Fred Fox asked about unleased trust minerals in the APD they are leasing under BLM and it is going to be a little bit of a problem, spacing to the walley is what we are referring to, also some Van Hook areas. Once Walley gets comfortable they will present to the Tribe. They will get information back to the committee. There was a new lease notice created. Would like to offer will have a new lease will go into the parcels.

The EA assessment, was just sent the corrected version, will need to look at it. The meeting in Houston went well, it was productive. Mr. Hallam is notifying the Committee of two travels and is requesting approval to travel. Clean water way conference on October 4 in Cincinatti, would like to go to help with the platform. The other is The Pipeline Safety Conference is one Mr. Hallam usually attends. Had our first incident today since 2019 with Cody Pipeline. It was not a large volumn but it was taken care of right away, last one was in 2019. Frank Lee contract renewal request. Frank would like an increase for cost of living, 8.7% Requesting to forward Frank Lee Contract. Councilman Fred Fox states he never sees Frank and does not know what he is doing.
