Now here we are in August already, the first day of school for the Mandaree students is on Tuesday, August 16th and the students will have their classes in the new school. This will be an exciting time for our kids to be in the new school. I am so happy we had a community garden this



year! The produce is almost ready to give to our elders. I would like to thank LeeAnna Nation and Roni Stiffarm for their commitment and dedication to our community garden. You can also read more about it on Information for our elders.

In other positive happenings here in Mandaree is we are getting a new water plant. Which is so needed for all our upcoming facilities and our community residents.

We have been doing without for too long and this has been one of my goals so now its becoming closer to a reality. Next is to upgrade our drain field/sewer system, after these two major projects are completed than we are closer to having other great projects to follow. We all know all these projects that need to get done all take time.

A service West Segment provides is light housekeeping, such as; vacuuming, sweeping, mopping and errand runs. To qualify for these benefits, you

must be of age 60 and enrolled with the tribe.

Please provide all your documents to me at least 7-12 days prior for scheduling. Please be advised all checks will be mailed out to the vendor, I will pick up the appointment travel checks and deliver them to you.



Our Community Garden has a lot of produce coming in such as; squash, watermelon, potatoes, carrots, beets, tomatoes and cucumbers.

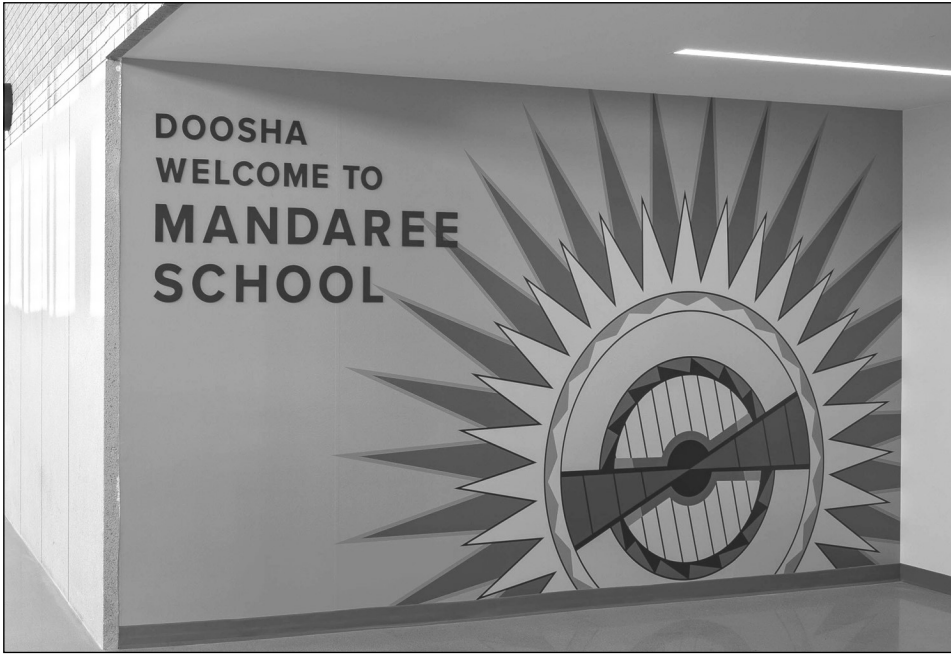


Even though the weather was foggy out as you can see in this picture, flag raising took place early in the morning as it always been.

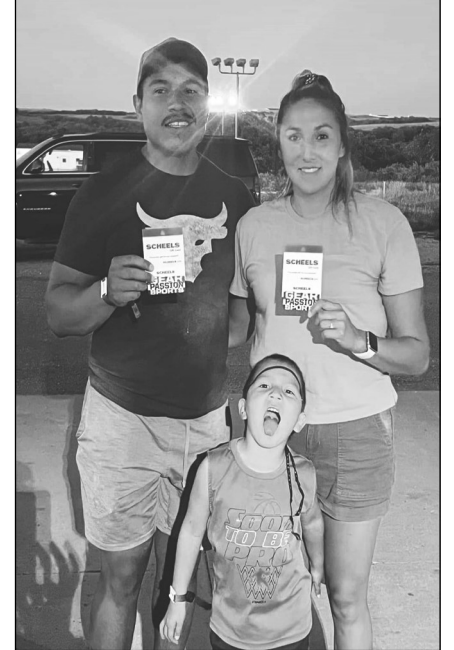

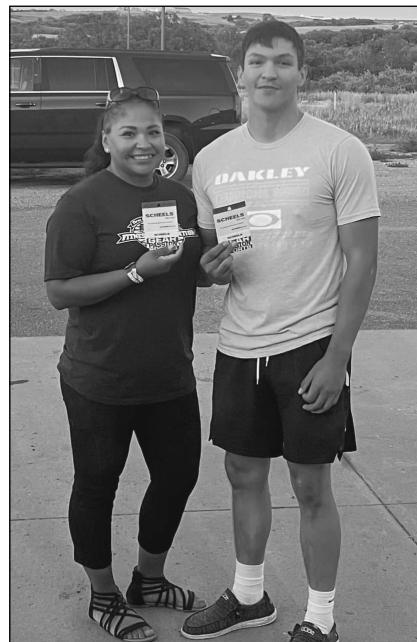

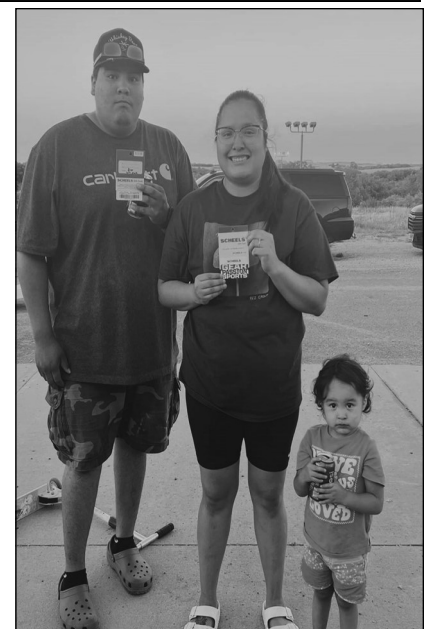

This was a much needed training experience with outstanding instructors! On behalf of this program they wish to say thank you to Diane, Brad, Ty, Heath and Joan for their memberships.

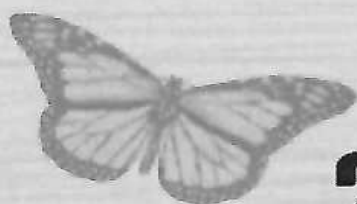

“MISSOURI”



The title of this article leaves a little to be desired, would you agree? Well then...an explanation is in order. Do you know that every state in these “United States of America” has a nickname? A nickname, being a short description of what each state wants to be known for. Here are just a few examples. The nickname of our state of North Dakota is the “Peace Garden” state. The nickname of our neighboring state of South Dakota is “Mount Rushmore” state. The nickname of the state of Montana is the “Treasure” state. You can find all the nicknames for all the states displayed on the vehicle license plates issued by each state. Or a much quicker way would be to look them up online (I know...right?). One of the states’ nicknames interests me more than any of the others. Which state? Of course...Missouri. The nickname of the state of Missouri is the “Show Me” state. That nickname is very interesting to me because it makes me wonder just what it is that anyone not from Missouri, is supposed to show them. I imagine the only way to find out what the meaning of “Show Me” is, would be to ask someone that is from Missouri. Makes sense...right?

There are other situations when the phrase “show me” is used. We get to a point of demanding that God “show me” this help that you said would be there if I just ask for it. That is when our relationship with God suffers. It does not have to be so. Yes, God does say in His scripture words that He will help us when we ask for help but realize that the help may not happen within the timeframe that we want it to. Be persistent in asking for His help, be prudent, be sincere, be patient. Be open to any manner of help that He will provide. God will “show you” His help in His time.

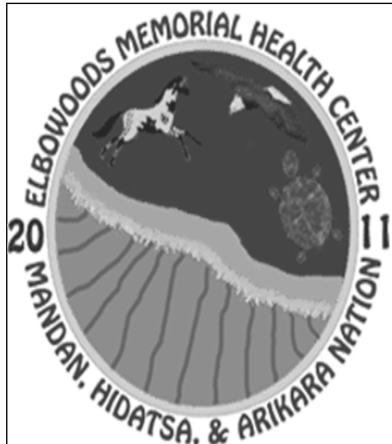

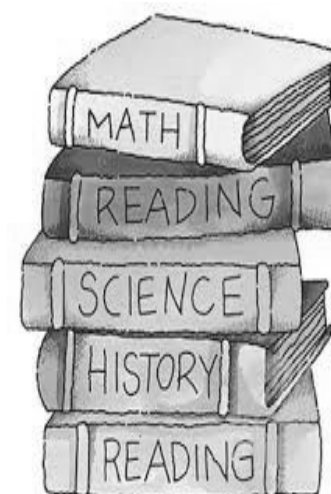

residents of Mandaree.

My mother is Marcia White Eagle and my father is the late Robert "Bobby" Finley Sr., who served in the US Army. My maternal grandparents are the late Julia (Charging-Mandan) White Eagle and the late Thomas White Eagle. My paternal grandparents are the late Louise (Black Hawk-Huber) Finley and the late Evan Finley Sr.

I am co-creator of Fort Berthold Protectors of Water and Earth Rights also known as POWER, until my candidacy. I was Vice-President of NDNV, and served on many other boards.

My education is a Master of Management and a Master of Business Administration from the University of Mary. I also hold a Bachelor of Science in Environment Science from the Nueta, Hidatsa and Sahnish College in New Town, North Dakota.

I would like to thank all who voted for me in the June Primary.

I am here today to ask for your vote on November 8, 2022 general election.

I am running for the new redistricted North Dakota District 4 A House that consists of all of Fort Berthold Reservation. We fought for Fort Berthold Reservation to have a voice at the North Dakota Legislature.

As a child, Pauline grew up in Oakland and Vallejo California until the age of thirteen. From then on, she lived on the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation.

She met Toby Young Bear while attending middle school in Mandaree, ND and from this union they had six children; Adeline Young Bear, Gabriel Casarez, Sophia Young Bear, Zoey Young Bear, Azrael Young Bear, and Pheobe Casarez (adopted by maternal Aunt Lisa Casarez from birth).

Later in life, she married Greg Fragoza and to this union they had their son, Justin Fragoza.

Pauline enjoyed cooking, she wanted to be a chef and so she proceeded into schooling for culinary arts, where she improved her cooking skills.

Growing up he loved the Power Rangers and always wanted to be the "Green Ranger". He also enjoyed Mortal Combat and professional wrestling.

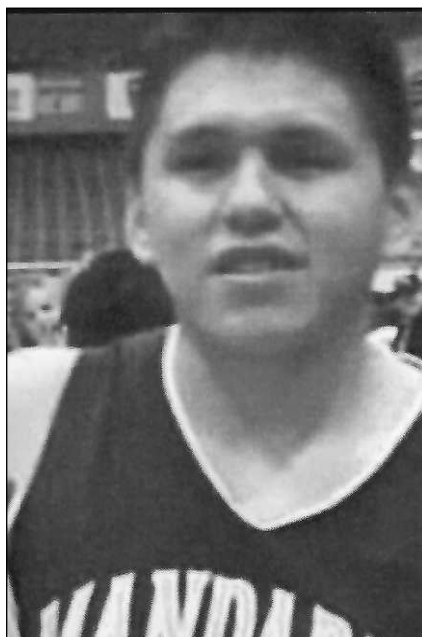

Years later I went to law school studied federal Indian law; international Indigenous People's Law. After earning my Juris Doctor (JD), I went on to earn my Masters In Environmental Law. I would later have the privilege of Teaching at the Law School level. While here I helped to establish the Masters Program First Nations Environmental Law Fellowship.

I actively participated at the United Nations in New York City, NY and in Geneva Switzerland and founded Adi Nuawacash, a program recovering youth of Ft. Berthold.

Before law school, I earned my Masters in Education. I taught at the University level. I was one of the founding members who built the Five College Indian Studies Program for the prestigious Five Colleges.

I have held executive level posts while working for our sister nation tribes. Including serving as Executive Director/CEO.

I have served as the Executive Director of non-profit organizations. In one instance I was able to bring a failing, about to be shuttered organization back from the abyss.

This is a just a snapshot of my experience over the course of these past 35 plus years.

I am ready to aggressively Represent the Nuetu Hidatsa Sahnish on September 20, 2022. Why wait for November, Right?

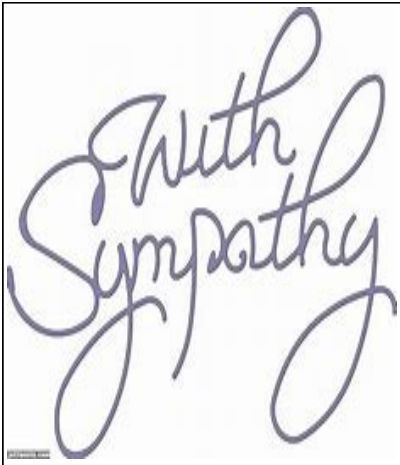
