

Doctor appointments and Elder ramps.







Shell drum as well as a rodeo man himself put on the memorial. This Memorial Rodeo was a first to remember rodeo's past. Driver Rodeo and Abrahamson Rodeo Company honored the first Elbowoods Rodeo from 1938. To start the first day, they had a timed event slack at 5pm. The opening ceremonies were at 12pm and the rodeo performance followed. \$5k added each in Bareback, Saddle bronc, Ladies Ranch Bronc riding and bull



riding. \$4k added each in Calf Roping, Team Roping, Ladies breakaway, Steer wrestling and Ladies barrel racing. There was a \$100 cash entry fee.

The first rodeo and the ones that followed in Elbowoods were produced by James Driver, and now his son Marvin put together the Elbowoods Memorial Rodeo to remember his dad and the contestants in the first contest. 




All children must be accompanied by an adult. If camping, you must have your own camping gear and be responsible for your own camp area; such as keeping it clean at all times.

Awe!



When you reflect on God and what God has created, do you have an overwhelming sense of wonder and awe? At our Diocesan Spring Conference in Bismarck our speaker Fr. John Riccardo, before he started his main presentation on how to present the story of Jesus to others, invited us to pray for the grace of wonder and awe and asked this question "Why is there something rather than nothing?" Of course, this question leads

to creation.

All cultures have some sort of creation story. Most of them involve multiple gods who are not pre-existing and who are usually at war with each other. Creation comes about usually through struggle or sex and human beings are created to serve them as slaves. In contrast to these stories the biblical story of creation is quite different. There is only one God who has always existed and this God is all good. Creation effortlessly comes about from love (not need) and is all good—"God said: Let there be light, and there was light. God saw that the light was good (Gen 1:3-4).

When one ponders creation itself, from the largest (the universe is 46 billion light years across made up of about 100 billion galaxies which contain about 100 billion stars in each galaxy) to the smallest (the subatomic particles such as quarks, gluons, electrons and neutrinos, etc.), we should be in awe. And God did this effortlessly! Out of love! Just because! What's more astonishing is that of all the created creatures in this vast universe, he loves one creature more than any other, YOU. God, who effortlessly created everything that exists from nothing, who continues to hold everything in existence, pays more attention to YOU than anything else in the universe.

When we ponder God in this light, more questions arise, basic questions like "Why am I here? Where am I going? How do I get there? The biblical answer to these questions, says Fr. Riccardo is love. YOU are here because this God of the universe wants you here. God created you to love you, to bless you, to abundantly shower you with gifts so your life will be full. You don't just happen to be here; you are here because it is good that you exist. You were created to be infinitely happy.

If this is so, "Where am I going?" "What is the purpose of my life?" The answer, says Fr. Riccardo, is love. You were created to be with God forever. You were created so God could love you by sharing his happiness and joy and abundant life with you forever. God sees you as His son or daughter. Everything God has is yours.

So "How do I get there?" Again, says Fr. Riccardo, the answer is love! Out of love for you, God sent Jesus, his Only Begotten Son, to die for you on the cross. You "get there" when you love God and others as you see God love you. How

great is the love Jesus has for his Father that he would be

willing to die for you! How great is the love of the Father that he sent his Son to die for you!


The biblical view of God is quite extraordinary. This is what Christian's call "The Good News" and want to share it with the world. It is exciting to live in this love. There is so much to experience when a person gets to know this love and lives in this love.

Fr. John Riccardo had much more to say. He asks and answers three more questions: "If everything God created is so good, why is everything so obviously messed up?" What, if anything, has God done to fix the mess? (And if God's fixed it, why are things still so messed up?) "And how should we reasonably respond to what God has done for us in Jesus?"


