Thanks to this agreement, the future looks brighter and safer. This is absolutely a step forward for the counties, for the state and for the tribe. Grateful to Chairman Fox and the council, NDHP and local sheriffs for your work on this

agreement and to the Legislature for passing two bills necessary to make this happen.

In part of this agreement with the NDHP, I would like to assure you that we are not losing our sovereignty, we just have more boots on the ground.

This is the month where trick or treaters will be out and about. So please everyone be aware of the kids walking from house to house collecting their candies.

For our elders, each of you are encouraged to get your flu shots and Covid Shots. The flu and Covid shots clinic were here at the Mandaree Ambulance garage on Tuesday, October 12th. For those elders who missed that date can also go to the following places; Northern Lights on October 21st and 28th from 3 to 5pm. Or at the Casino on October 22nd from 5 to 7pm. The NHSC College on October 27th from 3pm-4:30pm. Mask are required at all clinics; you are asked to pre-register at vaccinereg.health.nd.gov



It makes my heart feel good knowing the West Segment employees are working hard to get things done before the snow flies. I personally would like to acknowledge Jason Luke Jr., Cliff Martin, CJ, Kyle Miller and Curtis Hall who are

all working diligently in fixing the water line here in Mandaree. You can see a couple of photos on page 10.

A message for the employees who work for West Segment, drug testing will be coming up for you all and myself as well.

On another note, the Mandaree Grocery store is still a go, right now we are waiting on an engineer and the architects to be hired so they can do their assessments, master plan and contract. We are looking at December for the opening of the grocery store and the jump house. The jump house will still be inside the building. We still have a lot of organizing and cleaning to do, when that's all done, we are aiming to have them both open and running in December.

I would like to remind our people here in Mandaree that our West Segment office has nothing to do with the Fort Berthold Housing Authority.

As far as our Hidatsa housing in the Black Eagle Estates, I have an engineer firm that will come in and work on the water with sub pumps. This engineer will capture the water so it goes in the right place.

Our maintenance crew are all busy working on the White Oak trailer homes by taping the water pipes so our residences pipes don't freeze this winter.

Again, I would just like to remind our elders to make sure you get your flu shots and for those who haven't gotten vaccinated, please get vaccinated for yourself and for your family.

I would like to congratulate those who qualified for INFR are as follows; Tyrus Ashley a student at Mandaree School who qualified for the INFR Saddle bronc. Megan in ladies breakaway and Shannoah Danks in Jr. breakaway. Casey Stone in steer wrestling, Jesse qualified in the tie down in team roping, Bailey qualified in Jr. breakaway all qualified for the INFR. Also, to Charles Hale and Philip Lone Fight who had their bucking bulls qualify for the INFR. We have a lot of talented young cowboys and cowgirls. If I didn't mention your name, please forgive me it wasn't done intentionally.







Happy Cowgirls Megan and Shannoah Danks.




on the rodeo trail Casey is training horses.





in charge or all alone in my thinking and in my actions. Yet God is always there with a loving and forgiving heart ready to lift me up with his loving presence.



Daily School Attendance Critical To Success

Regular school attendance is a challenge every year. The challenge is even greater as we battle through the pandemic.

A day out of school is a day out of school regardless of the reason. When a student is not present in school an "Absent" is recorded. The State and Federal reporting the District is required to do does not differentiate between an "excused" or "unexcused" absence. It is reported as a day absent. That is reason that language was removed from the Student Handbook.

In order to meet the 95% Average Daily Attendance Rate a student can miss no more than eight (8) days per school year. That is about two (2) days per quarter. That is definitely a challenge during these COVID times.

The District will assist every student to meet this goal. When absences occur the District will reach out and provide families the support needed to make up the days missed.

Days absent need to be made up as soon as possible so there is no lingering consequences such as non-crediting a class.

It is in your child's best interest to get absences made up as soon as possible.

There will be a three (3) week window at the end of each quarter to focus a strong effort to get the days made up from previous quarter.

This is so that it will present a reasonable and doable goal. Waiting until March or April to worry about absences creates undue stress on families and teachers.




