Greeting to Everyone

I hope everyone had a nice holiday season and this new calendar year treats everyone well. It is always nice to bring the new year in at home in Twin Buttes with family. The older I get the less likely I will stay awake on New Year's Eve. These past few years I am sleeping when the clock strikes midnight.

I would like to take time to extend my condolences to all the families that have recently lost loved ones. My heart goes out to the Morsette family with the passing of my life-long friend, Chad Morsette, Sr. His Indian name was "Red Fish," and I remember knowing his Indian name when I was just a small boy. I have known Chad my entire life and we were childhood friends. I remember playing many playground games together when we were kids. He was always very agile and outgoing. I particularly remember tackle football and all the fun we had together. I don't ever remember him getting angry, he was always cheerful and the master at teasing and good clean fun. I know Chad was a talented person, and I witnessed him accomplish many achievements in his life. We shared a lot in common as we both loved basketball, Sundance way of life, and hunting deer.

Chad was an accomplished basketball player. In high school Chad attended Golden Valley. I suppose because he lived far out East in Beaver Creek area. The rest of us went to high school in Halliday and Chad always gave us a tremendous challenge when we

played them, almost single handedly. I once witnessed him score over 70 points in a basketball league game in Beulah. In that same game he had 18 three pointers. One time I came home from college and Chad and I met up on the outdoor court in front of the old community hall. We played one on one for many hours straight into the evening time. We always brought that story up many years later and Chad's favorite part of the story was that he beat me more times than I beat him. Chad also played semiprofessional basketball for a short period in Bismarck, ND when he tried out and briefly made the roster for the Bismarck Wizards. Chad was also an accomplished deer hunter with many good bucks under his belt. I was surprised when I hunted with him about how well he knew the land from Beaver Creek out east to as far west as you can possibly go in Twin Buttes.

After I had a paralyzed leg we went hunting together and when he was opening a gate for me, a big buck ran out. I harvested the buck and thanked Chad for opening the gate and allowing me first chance at the buck. We had a good laugh over it afterward. Most important Chad was a devoted family man, always spending time with his wife and children. He encouraged his son, Chad Jr., to carry on his basketball legacy. Chad Jr. became one of the greatest high school basketball players in the state. He was proud to come from the Home of the Champions. The late Chad Sr. was good to his parents and to his siblings. He was also an accomplished grass dancer and in his prime he frequently won contest dances. He was a good powwow dancer and he like to



raise heck with people. This made him an outstanding Halloween masquerade dancer and he took home the first place prize money many times!

He was a Sundancer and a prayer man. We were able to sweat and pray together on a handful of occasions. My entire life I never seen him angry, he mostly just liked to tease and have fun and laugh, always in a cheerful mood. There are probably many good deeds that I don't know about my friend, Chad, but I am certain the list of his accomplishments are long. I am going to miss my lifelong friend. I will think of him often. I know he will look after our community and we will all see each other again someday.

I also want to extend my condolences to the Rosella Little Soldier family. At the time of her passing, Rosella was the eldest member of the MHA Nation. Rosella was born in 1918 and lived to be 103. I was thinking about how this year would have been her "second" golden birthday. She was born on August 4th and she would have been 104 this summer. I asked her for advice on her 100th birthday. I asked her what wisdom

she would share and she responded, "Live a clean life. If you keep your life clean, everything will go good for you. Stay close to God and keep your life clean." I thanked her and told her that I would remember what she told me." Another thing I thought of about Rosella is that she would have been in her mid to late 30's when Elbowoods was flooded. Rosella was a wealth of knowledge and an outstanding citizen of our great MHA Nation. August 4th has been declared Rosella Little Soldier Day for perpetuity, recognized by the MHA Nation as testimony to the exemplary life that Rosella lived. In her own right she was a leader and a matriarch among our Tribe.

The cold Winter months have settled in on us and it seems like it has been a few years since we have had a snowy cold Fort Berthold winter. I think the cold is good for our environment killing all the germs and making all things new again in the Spring. The blanket of snow gives our grasses and medicines a layer of protection and the melting Spring snow gives our lands a jump start and some badly needed moisture for a successful growing season. The drought and the cold temps have made it difficult on our ranchers and those who own livestock. There is a need this winter for emergency hay and feed for our ranchers.

Freezing temps and an accumulation of snow this year has slowed down some of the community construction. Nonetheless, our contractors will continue on in winter conditions making progress on our development projects. The new clinic under construction is completely enclosed now and we anticipate a June/July 2022 completion date. The new clinic will provide

some needed office and personnel space that we currently do not have. More services, such as optometry, dental, telemedicine and ambulatory services will be available in the new clinic. We will enhance and improve upon our current medical services.

The new fair grounds construction will continue forward as contractors prepare to pour foundation footings for the new indoor equestrian arena. Soon our youth will be able to work with horses year-round and our community will host many events in the Winter to keep our local cowboys and cowgirls competing and in good shape. This will also provide a wonderful economic opportunity for our Twin Buttes community as we host equestrian events and invite folks from all around. Soon to follow the indoor arena construction will be an outdoor rodeo arena grandstands, Indian relay race track, as well as a new powwow dance arbor and powwow grounds.

Oil prices have been steadily climbing and the WTI index lists oil in the mid \$80's. This is good for our tribe and our opportunity to continue to develop our outlying communities that have gone without essential services since our inception after the flooding of our beloved river bottom. This Winter the Twin Buttes administration will continue to plan and prepare for Spring construction. Our newly paved roads will have to be maintained with routine annual maintenance, so we do not lose our pavement and our community infrastructure investment. Water, electrical, and waste water lines will be installed. Tree planting and overall beautification will continue on in the upcoming Spring and Summer months. We will continue to address our needs for housing and home improvement as well as address any poor or substandard living conditions that any of our community members might be exposed to.

I look forward to continuing to serve our Twin Buttes community as Councilman and Vice-Chairman of our great MHA Nation. We have many exciting initiatives to look forward to such as a new Twin Buttes High School. I will write more about these exciting projects in a future edition of our Twin Buttes Times newsletter.

I hope everyone looks forward to the sunshine and the warmer days that are coming, but also take the time to participate in all the wonderful Winter activities this time of year has to offer. My son, Niibwin, wants to do some ice fishing so we will soon be looking for a good spot on the lake to pull some walleyes up thru the ice.

I also hope everyone is staying safe and healthy as we continue to navigate these unprecedented times of Covid and changing climate. We are navigating towards a bright and promising future for our community and our Tribe. I hope we can all give kindness, help, and encouragement to each other along the way.

With that, I say



Rosella "Red Rose" "Micgabaa-hishi" Hall Little Soldier, 103, beloved Mother and Grandmother, a member of the Low Cap Clan, passed peacefully into the arms of her Savior, Jesus Christ, on Sunday, January 30, 2022. Surrounded by loving family here on earth, she was surely welcomed with shouts of joy in Heaven.

A celebration of Rosella's life is scheduled to be held at the Twin Buttes Wellness Center, Twin Buttes, ND on Thursday, February 3, 2022 at 10:00 AM CST with Waylon American Horse officiating. Burial will follow at Beaver Creek Cemetery, Twin Buttes, ND.

A wake service will begin at 5:00 PM CST on Wednesday, February 2 at the Twin Buttes Wellness Center.

Rosella was born on August 4, 1918, in Elbowoods, ND, to James Hall Sr. and Sarah Fredericks. She was one of 11 children, and at the time of her passing was the oldest living member of the Three Affiliated Tribes.

Rosella married her sweetheart, Nathan Little Soldier, on October 16, 1938. To this union were born five sons, two of whom died in infancy. Their son, Shotae, died in 1996. Surviving children are Dale (Suzie) of Mandan, ND, and Arby (Patricia) of Albuquerque, NM.

Nathan died in August of 1980.

Rosella served others in many capacities throughout her long life and was lovingly called Mother or Grandmother or Auntie by many who were not her own. She worked for North Dakota State Extension

Service for 20 years. She was a member of the Twin Buttes School Board as well as the Twin Buttes Congregational Church Council. The roll she enjoyed the most was being the caretaker for her grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Rosella is survived by sons Dale and Arby, seven grandchildren, Coby Little Soldier, Mandy Grossman, Nathan Little Soldier, Tyler Little Soldier, Karen Little Soldier, Skye Little Soldier and Jessica Arkeketa; nine great-grandchildren, Taylor Eder, JD Little Soldier, Shotaya Plenty Hoops, Kaylie Little Soldier, Skylar Little Soldier, Adrianna Little Soldier, Taylon Little Soldier, Kateri Grossman, Jax Little Soldier and Lola Little Soldier; and two great great grandchildren, Grayson Plenty Hoops and Taylen Plenty Hoops.

CLAY HOLLIS SMITH August 18, 1969 - January 17, 2022


