

It is a stark contrast from the major drought last summer to this flourishing summer. Our farmers and ranchers are getting a good hay crop this year and all the medicines are in abundance on the land this season.

I would like to thank everyone that has supported me through two consecutive four year terms on the Tribal Business Council. I have served our community and nation for nearly 8 years now. I am currently the Vice Chairman of the Tribe. The time has flown by. I have more gray hairs then I started with. It has been a wonderful opportunity and the experience that I have gained is valuable. Leadership and decision making requires commitment and dedication. It requires being at the table when resources are available and allocated. It requires diplomacy and good reason. We have built a good team in Twin Buttes. I would like to acknowledge the Twin Buttes Segment staff. Without the assistance of a hard working staff the community would not look and feel like it does. It is the staff that runs the day to day business that we all count on to answer requests and keep our business moving forward.

There have been many achievements the past eight years. What I am most proud of are the jobs that have been created, the homes that have been built, and the services that have been provided. Our little community is developing and we are moving in a positive direction.

There are several projects that are under construction now. The Twin Buttes Fairgrounds project is well underway and when it is all completed it will be an economic stimulus opportunity for our community and region. With the RV park we will be able to host recreational goers and seasonal visitors which in return will support local opportunity for vendors, food sales, and local services. Our community must capitalize on the increased visitor traffic in order to sustain ourselves. If we do not create a local economy we have no future to be self-reliant. It is important to be self-sufficient as our old people have told us that is how we use to be and how we should be today. the lake. Next summer the new powwow grounds will be back near where it originally was to the south of the new community center. Still in progress is the Buffalo pasture and handling facility as well as elk pasture fence.

Some major projects that I would like to continue to pursue in the next few years are the Twin Buttes High School, the elders assisted living building and elders care campus, an eagle aviary, a new housing subdivision, cold storage facility, a new tribal administration building, a renewable energy grid system, a meat processing facility, fire station, green house, and manufacturing plant to create more permanent job opportunities. The Twin Buttes segment staff will be doing a community wide survey asking every man woman and child to fill out and submit a survey asking what our community members and voting membership would like to see in development, services, local opportunities, and recreation in Twin Buttes. I really want to hear from everyone what our local needs and wants are so we can get to work creating those opportunities. Please participate in the survey. We want to hear from everyone. Eight years ago I started with a communitywide survey and a developed plan to execute the work. I got started on that list and knocked most of it out.

The Tribal Business Council as a whole is working very hard; so many meetings, work sessions, and planning ahead for the future of our tribe. There is much to look forward to. I will keep working hard for all of us



and I plan to try to do even more at a more aggressive pace. There are many services our small isolated community needs and depends on.

I would like to send a special thank you to my wife Sierra and her sister Marita who work hard on our newsletter. They always do a wonderful job and I am thankful for their talent and commitment.




# Twin Buttes Horse Culture



Judy Faye Fredericks was born on December 18, 1943, at Nishu on the Ft. Berthold Indian reservation. Her parents were Matthew White Bear Sr. and Alice Eagle White Bear. She was the great-granddaughter of Sitting Bear. Judy was adopted into the Knife Clan by her sister Gwen Hostler, which was witnessed by Rose Marie and Tony Mandan. She attended school in Nishu, Elbowoods, and White Shield, where she graduated in 1961. She then attended Sawyer Business school in California for two years where she learned all the tools that would carry her through her professional career. She then moved home where she worked for White Shield Head Start from 1963 to 1968 where she realized her love of working with children. She then relocated to Bismarck, ND, and began her employment with the North Dakota Game and Fish Department and later for Vocational Rehabilitation. Around this time, she met the love of her life, John "Buzz" Fredericks. As they became more serious, she began to travel between Twin Buttes and Bismarck working by his side for the National Indian Cattlemen's Association. By 1973, she moved to Twin Buttes full-time where she ranched with her husband and their children. In 1990, she began working for Even Start and the Twin Buttes School where she would retire after 24 years of devoted employment and many years of performing a job she truly loved. She moved to Bismarck in 2015 to be near her children and grandchildren who she loved dearly.

Her retirement allowed her to do the things she enjoyed most. She spent a lot of her time with family, traveling, gardening, and working out. She gained many friends in Bismarck through regularly attending church and "silver sneakers" classes at the YMCA. Judy was a devout Catholic, who believed in the power of prayer. She attended annual Kateri Tekakwitha conferences and even made a trip to Rome to see the holy city. Whenever she couldn't find something, she would pray to St. Anthony, and moments later, the lost item was found. Her strong faith translated to her family in this way.

She had a lifelong love of country and gospel music. She loved to shake a leg on any dance floor and was proud to teach her children and grandchildren how to dance. She also loved to read, and was famous for having a book by her bedside that she would read nightly. She loved taking long walks which often included laps around shopping centers (if you know, you know). Many of her children and grandchildren competed in rodeos. Judy was always in the crowd to show her support and she developed a love for the sport this way. She was a member of the North Dakota Cowboy Hall of Fame and enjoyed attending and supporting their events. Most of all, she loved cooking and baking. If you were ever lucky enough to have the food she had prepared, you know this was one of her greatest skills. She never allowed company to leave her house on an empty stomach.

Judy is survived by her children Gerald White Bear, Les White Bear, Gary Fredericks, Kathy Johnson (Rick), Fred Fredericks (Kimm), her grandchildren Ty White Bear, Kayla Rhone (Zach), Thomas Fredericks, Justice Johnson, and Ashley Fredericks and great-grandchildren Rayden Fredericks, Rakye Fredericks and Ridge Rhone, her brother Paul White Bear (Johanna) and many nieces and nephews.

Kamixe Xopini (Sacred Circle Orchard)

The Twin Buttes community orchard was created in 2017, a priority project of Councilman Cory Spotted Bear, whose vision was for a community orchard where community can gather, enjoy, and thrive in good health.

Named Kamixe Xopini (Sacred Circle) because the design is in the shape of a medicine wheel to signify healing and highlights the importance of culture.

Primarily comprised of juneberries, a cultural treasure and dietary staple to the people of the MHA Nation, the orchard is also home to other fresh fruit that includes currants, cherries, elderberries, apricots, and apples.

Besides providing a wide range of environmental benefits including providing pollinator habitats and sequestering carbon (a goal of reducing global climate change), it also builds opportunities for microenterprise, a hands-on food system, and provides a green space for nature education, as well as community gathering and engagement.

Most importantly our orchard is an essential step toward a self-sustaining food system that re-establishes our food sovereignty and creates a path for future generations to thrive in good health and happiness.


