Councilman Fred Fox's Greetings


Hello Elders, Community Members and Relatives,

White Shield Warriors to have six-man football team

McLean County has a new kid on the block to root for in football this season.

Aug. 3 marked the first meeting of White Shield's sixman football team.

Head coach Shannon Hodges has quite the task laid out in front of him as this program is uncharted territory for the White Shield Warriors.

Six-man football is not the typical 11-man style of play many are used to and features some key changes from standard 11-man gameplay.


In six-man football, every player on the field is an eligible receiver. The player receiving the snap (the quarterback typically) is not allowed to advance the ball past the line of scrimmage themselves. Quarterback sneaks and direct snaps to the running back are out the door in this game. It takes 15 yards to gain a first down versus the standard 10, and extra points are flipped in six-man football.

A PAT is worth two with one point conversions being actual plays ran after the touchdown.

Playing six-man football significantlylimitsthe

competition the Warriors will be able to schedule matchups against. This leaves them with a season schedule of: Trenton at home, an away game at Drayton, a home matchup against Center-Stanton, a home game against Mandaree, and an away game against Center-Stanton to close the season out.

White Shield's five-game football schedule will kick off on Sept. 2 at home at 7 p.m. against Trenton.

MHA Division of Drug Enforcement K9 Teams Place Nationally in the 23rd Annual American Working Dogs (AWD) K9 Olympics in Denver, Indiana

The MHA Division of Drug Enforcement's K9 Teams were invited to compete in the 23rd Annual American Working Dogs (AWD) K9 Olympics held August 21-26, 2022 in Denver, Indiana at Vohne Liche Kennels.

K9 Teams from various Law Enforcement and Public Safety Agencies across the United States and other countries from around the world competed in the following Patrol

and/or Detection Events as part of the K9 Olympics. K9 Handlers also participated in various Training Seminars and Certification Trials.

K9 Patrol Events: Area Search, Building Search, Control, Hogans Alley, Obedience, Tracking, Obstacle Course. K9 Detection Events: Building Detection, Luggage, Open Area, Road Clear, Scramble, Exterior Vehicle, Interior Vehicle, Warehouse, Residential.

Out of 150 K9 Teams competing, MHA Drug Enforcement had two K9 Teams place high in two events. Patrol Agent Nate Miller and K9 Broder placed 1st in the Narcotics Residential Event. Patrol Agent Britney Larvie and K-9 Riki placed 2nd in the Narcotics Vehicle Exterior Event.

Other MHA Drug Enforcement K9 Patrol Units who competed in multiple events this year were Patrol Agent Coby Janis with K9 Metin, Patrol Agent Joshua Pastir with K9 Zorro, and Patrol Agent Joseph Larvie, Jr. with K9 Roxo. This is the second year competing at the K9 Olympics for MHA Drug Enforcement's K9 Teams. In 2021, Patrol Agent Pastir with K9 Zorro placed 2nd in the Narcotics Building Search Event.

MHA Drug Enforcement Deputy Chief Jeff White as a K9 Trainer was invited as a Judge for the Explosives Detection Events. Deputy Chief White has been an event judge at the K9 Olympics for the last 3 years.

"Highly trained law enforcement dogs are instrumental to suspect apprehension, locating missing individuals by tracking, detection of narcotics, and detection of other potentially harmful devices and substances. Our Patrol Agents are dedicated to training with their dogs consistently and expanding their skillsets as a team. All of our K9 Teams did an outstanding job and are a credit to the Mandan Hidatsa Arikara Nation," Deputy Chief White.

Up in enrollment

Enrollment in schools throughout McLean County have increased for the most part as doors opened for the first day of classes over the past two weeks.

Except for Max, the remainder of schools in the county – Garrison, White Shield, Underwood, Turtle

Lake-Mercer, Washburn and Wilton – have all seen increases. Enrollment there was down a total of 12 students, said Larry Sebastian, dean of students at Max Public School.

"We had a large senior class last year and a smaller incoming pre-Kindergarten class," Sebastian said, noting that this year has a class of 14 seniors and eight pre-Kindergartners.

"I think this is normal," he said in relation to the fluctuating sizes of incoming and outgoing classes affecting the student census. "It just depends on the year."

Garrison

While the Kindergarten class is "one of our smallest," superintendent Nick Klemisch noted that the school's population is "up some from last year."

"We do have a number of new kids that are new to the community, which is nice to see," he said. "That's at both schools."

There are a total of 222 students at Bob Callies Elementary School and 162 students at Garrison High School; if the district's 16 homeschooled students are included into the numbers, the Garrison Public School District has an even 400 students. The school district is by far the biggest in terms of enrollment in the county. Of the 384 students who attend classes at the elementary or high school, 40 are open enrolled students who live in other school districts.

"We're getting more open enrollments from out west," Klemisch said. "That started a couple years ago."

About 30, or 75 percent of the open enrolled students, are from Parshall or White Shield.

White Shield

The number of students currently enrolled at the White Shield School is "significantly up from last year," noted superintendent Wayne Fox.

As of Aug. 25, the school had 191 students, which was an increase from the number of students the school had last year, Fox said. "We were sitting around 172."

Fox attributed the increase "The jump is probably (because of) our football season," Fox added. "Having our first football six-man team for the first time in a long time, I'm pretty sure we have the influx of young boys coming in to play. That's probably where we can contribute it to."

While the number of open enrolled students at the school is small, the majority – like Garrison – are from the Parshall School District.

"Being a new school and new environment with everything kind of going up, it's the place too be," Fox said.

The numbers are a departure from when Fox taught sixth grade at White Shield in 2014.

"When I first took the job, the teacher ratio was 12:1," Fox said. "Right now, we're sitting at 17:1 or 18:1."







USMC Silent Drill Platoon in New Town for veteran appreciation

NEW TOWN, N.D. (KMOT) – The MHA Nation celebrated their soldiers Tuesday in New Town with a special exhibition.

The Marine Corps Silent Drill Platoon from Washington D.C. extended their tour season to come out and perform for North Dakota veterans. The tribes stated that a higher rate of Native Americans serve in the armed forces than other groups, and wanted to show appreciation to these and other local veterans for their service.

"They do, definitely, honor us a lot. For them to be able to come again and for us to be a part, even better. My uncle was the reason I joined and he was a marine so to be a part of it was even better," said Amber Red Fox, Army Veteran. Free food and the ceremony brought out hundreds of people to check out the demonstration, including nearby schools to watch the performance and learn about service in their communities.

"The tradition, the culture, for them to see the hard work that these veterans have given us, have been giving us, and will be giving us," said Jeremiah Prego, teacher.


The 24-man Silent Drill Platoon first performed in the sunset parades of 1948 in D.C., and the precision exhibition was so popular they made it a regular part of ceremonies.

"It was a great honor. I'm really touched by it being a Marine and seeing them perform, bringing them to the people. What I like is that the children and the schools get to see it and hopefully they think about joining military service," said Mylo Spotted Horse, a Marine veteran.

The Marines in the platoon serve on a twoyear ceremonial tour. They use 10.5-pound M1 Garands for the exercise.

This was the platoon's second time in New Town, and officials hope to bring them back a third time for an even bigger event.
