Obituary

Josephine Inez Parenteau was born January 28, 1931, at home in Independence, to Simon and Edna (Medicine Crow) White Owl. She attended Independence Day School and Elbowoods High School. When she was in high school, she took care of her nephews. She received her GED in Minot and continued her education at Minot College. Josephine lived in Minot for ten years and worked in the hospitals.

Josephine met Donald Parenteau in Minot, while he was serving in the United States Air Force. They were married and transferred to Japan for over three years. During this time, she worked in the NCO Club. She toured the area and even climbed Mount Fuji.
