Next month's newsletter I will get the amount for the total amount disbursed back to the People since 2012.

This coming 2025 White Shield will be completing all of the 4 projects that are currently being constructed. The Professional Housing Twin Homes will be all complete January of 2025. The White Shield Boys & Girls Club and Daycare will be completed March of 2025. The Ralph Wells Jr. Complex Remodel will be completed June of 2025, this is a project that we all can't wait for. This is a 50 year old historic building that will be kept for the next 50 years. The last project



will be completed is the Son of Star Casino. Substantial completion is scheduled to be July of 2025. The Job Fair at the Community Center is currently going on for all the community members in White Shield.

I would finally like to wish everyone Happy Holidays and Safe Travels wherever your Holiday journeys take you.

WHITE SHIELD, ND (KXNET) — The White Shield Farmers Market has become a vibrant gathering spot for the community this year, offering locally made food, drinks, and handcrafted items.

As market coordinator, Llore Dickens Two Crow explained, “It is just an opportunity for all the locals to come together and showcase their creations whether it be from gardening to canning to products to wellness, new businesses, young entrepreneurs, small businesses.”

The market, which started its season in April, will host its final fall harvest event this Sunday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Ralph Wells Community Complex, with over 40 vendors expected.

“It brings a lot of people just in the local area to have a sense of community pride,” said Two Crow.

The market has grown into a significant community event, drawing in residents from the area who take pride in supporting local businesses.

Two Crow highlights the range of offerings saying, “We have marinaras, salsas, pickles, peaches, and sweet chili sauces—all from our Two Crow Gardens. We have about seven huge gardens filled with fresh produce.”

One of the market’s most unique aspects is its focus on health and wellness. Alvina Wolf, owner of AJ Wellness and a regular vendor, offers PEMF (pulsed electromagnetic field) therapy at the market.

“PEMF therapy increases circulation, reduces inflammation, and provides pain relief,” Wolf explained. “It’s good for so many things.”

The holistic approach to wellness at the market underscores the idea that it’s not just about food, but about improving overall quality of life.

The fall harvest market is a celebration of the season and the culmination of the hard work put in by local growers and producers.

“It’s just a good place to showcase everybody’s talents and it has been a really really good big success for the community,” said Two Crow.

She moved to Los Angeles, California, in the 1960s with her parents. While in California, she created lifelong friendships. Losing her father at a young age, she stepped in and helped her mother with her brothers and sisters. She was the first of 5 children.

She graduated from John Glenn High School in Los Angeles in 1968. She attended United Tribes Technical College Trade School in Bismarck, ND, where she studied painting. Clarine moved to Minnesota in 1984, where she worked at DIW. For over ten years, she helped serve food and assisted people in need with social and other services. She then went to work for the Indian Program for a short time and helped young mothers by making appointments for themselves and their children.

In 1998, Clarine began working for Independent School District #196 in the Indian Education Program. She had wanted to work in education since she was a young girl. While at ISD196, she collaborated with people from all over the country and gained many students. Dedicated to teaching young minds of all ages, she took pride in her effort and work ethic. Her students, co-workers, and her students' parents all spoke highly of her with loving respect. Clarine could teach the importance of learning a lesson while helping them solve the problem, showing her students they could. Some of her students had children who later became Clarine's students. Clarine was liked and loved by many in the ISD196 community.

Clarine liked to play bingo, go to movies and eat popcorn, and travel to visit friends, family, and loved ones. She listened to various music, but her favorites were Motown, The Eagles, and classic country. Family, friends, and associates often asked her to make fry bread for her many events. She could always tell a good story to lighten and brighten any occasion.

Clarine Packineau, 73, Rapid City, SD, passed away at her home on Saturday, August 31, 2024. She was preceded in death by her parents, Phyllis and Calvin Packineau; brothers, Fred, Frank, and Calvin Paul Packineau; sisters, Debbie Packineau and Emmaline Crows Heart; and her cats, Stinky and Lucky "Doozer".

Mary Lynn was a wonderful gift of a person who greeted everyone she met with a warm smile and a good story. Her charm lay in her innocence. She was given the name Comes Back Elder after thriving beyond complications experienced at birth and living her life full of family and many friends. As the youngest of four children, her family was blessed to spend 63 years in her presence.

Mary Lynn Wells "Comes Back" (súxtIt tawísa') was born May 7, 1961, in Garrison, ND, to Marie (Deane) Wells and Thomas Wells, Sr. She was an enrolled member of the Three Affiliated Tribes, and a child of the Waterbuster Clan. She was raised in the Lucky Mound area and completed kindergarten through 7th grade in the Parshall School System.

As a beloved daughter, sister, aunt, grandma, and cat-mom, Mary enjoyed her role in the family and shared a special relationship with each generation. As a daughter and youngest sister, she spent time in her childhood home with her mother, Marie, from birth into adulthood. Here, Mary was most proud of raising two generations of Siamese cats, a father and son duo known as Jon Jon and Bozz. Her long-time feline companion was Bozz, who lived to the age of 14, and he seemed to terrorize all visitors but affectionately loved his owner.

Marie was one of Mary's fiercest protectors, ensuring she grew up immersed in her traditional and Catholic values. Her family were members of the St. Bridget Catholic Parish of Parshall, ND. She was strong in her faith and often shared prayers with those she cared for. Her prayers were extra special, and those whom she prayed with and for felt the sincerity behind them.

Mary also served as a knowledgeable source of her Arikara language and teachings. She would often share stories and language lessons with her nieces and grandchildren. The home she shared with her mother was the "hub" for all the family gatherings (birthdays and holidays). Their doors were always open to family and friends who traveled to spend time visiting the Fort Berthold area. Mary enjoyed her time in the kitchen and loved to bake for visitors. She was famous for her traditional cornbread,

which no other family member has quite perfected since she passed the recipe down.

She enjoyed her time with her siblings and loved all three (Laurie, Cleo, and Thomas) unconditionally. Mary would often share stories about growing up near the Old Lucky Mound School and the mischief her older siblings dragged into her. As an adult and following her mom's passing, she asserted her independence and ability to live on her own. She did so until moving to the Bismarck area with her older sister, Cleo, in 2011. In 2013, Mary wanted to demonstrate her love for her siblings by asking to be tested as a possible stem-cell match for her older sister, Laurie, who was diagnosed with Leukemia. She came back as a 100% match, but the risk involved to Mary outweighed the benefit. Mary continued to fight for her ability to help prolong her sister's life. Laurie helped her come to terms with her determination, and she appreciated the sacrifice her youngest sister, Mary, was willing to make.

Mary did not have children of her own. Yet, she served as a matriarch of her family. She loved her nieces and nephews and was eager to teach them how to play card games. Her favorite was the infamous "Slapjack," often followed by an eruption of laughter due to the fun had. In addition to being "the fun aunt," Mary also served as the disciplinarian and was not afraid to initiate a needed time-out session when required.

Nonetheless, her nieces and nephews knew that Mary's actions stemmed from love and her innocence in life. As they grew older, Mary did her best to support and encourage each of them through their academic and life journeys. She was always available to her nieces and nephews, whether it was a quick phone call to catch up or to take a cross-country road trip for a surprise wedding. Mary was blessed to spend time with their children, her grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Mary was a known staple in her hometown of Parshall, where she was an active member of the Parshall American Legion Auxiliary Post 121. She took many of her community members as family, and her community took care of her. She would often tell stories of community members helping her discover and develop her talents, such as needlepoint. Since her passing, community members have all shared affectionate and kind stories about Mary Lynn. In addition to creating her community family in Parshall, Mary also gained more extended family from the people she got to know in the Bismarck area, such as her close friends Tillie Little Soldier and Verna Baker.

In July of 2024, Mary was diagnosed with Multiple Myeloma and entered the hospital due to resulting complications. She spent a brief time at Miller Point in Mandan, ND, and was later transferred to St. Vincent's in Bismarck, ND, following re-entry to the hospital in September 2024. Mary journeyed from this life on Sunday, September 29, 2024.

She had many roles in life, from sister to storyteller. Yet, Mary was a prime example of seeing the specialness and fullness of life in its simplicity. Some of her favorite activities included completing word searches and crossword puzzles, going for a drive, singing along to her favorite songs on car rides, chatting on the phone with loved ones, attending powwow celebrations, attending church services, and sharing a smile and good laugh with those willing to listen. The impact created by Mary's life

will live long in the hearts of her family and friends through the lasting memories made.

Mary is survived by her brother, Thomas Wells Jr. (Dorothy) of Parshall; nieces, Vonnie Jo Alberts of New Town, Vicki Marie Alberts of Mandan, Alyssa Ann Alberts of Mandan, Corrine Felix-Wells of Bismarck, and Amber Warman of Bismarck; nephews, Tyler Wells of Bismarck, Lindsey (Hunter) Stevenson of Bismarck, Daniel Ripley of Bismarck, and Jackson (Lyz) Ripley of Cloquet, MN; grandchildren, Tyree "Robin" Wells, Vonica (Jordan) Laplante-Oliva, Vivica Paul, Danica Paul, ArikaRee Alberts, Markenna Wells, Inaani Wilson, Tusweca Wilson, Ian Thomas Smith, Saint Felix, Grace Smith, Sophia Smith, Owen Smith, Jr., Ellie Smith, Winter Stevenson, Bruce Wayne Delonais, and Laurie MaRee Smith; great-grandchildren, Sage & Savannah Old Coyote and River Valentino White; and her many cousins.

Road to Recovery

Peyton Yellow Wolf didn't think she needed to quit drinking. She grew up with older family members who drank, but she said, "I didn't understand what they were going through." That changed when her drinking habit began to land him in legal trouble.



"Legal issues came up and to get out of them I would go into treatment and sober up, only to fall off the wagon when I got home," Peyton said, who grew up in Mandaree, N.D.

After several failed attempts she was brought into the sober living program in White Shield. Part of that program is to have a full-time job. To help, Old #8 Diner is opening its doors to this sober living program and its recovering clients.

In the past, Yellow Wolf said she would work at a job only for a few weeks then quit and go back drinking.

"But at the Diner I love it. I love my coworkers. I love my bosses. I love coming to work. I am able to go to sweats. They have really helped me pray and it's really a cool environment," Yellow Wolf said.

Another worker at the new restaurant is Cleo Short, from Fort Belknap, Mont. She has been a drug user and alcoholic for 19 years and was surrounded by addiction and abusive men.

"I finally lost my kids, house, and became homeless," Short said.

A relative reached out and got her in contact with MHA Nation's Good Road Recovery Center, located in Bismarck. The center provided the logistics to get Short in the program, which has branches in each segment of Fort Berthold Reservation, including White Shield.

"It was here that I finally found my sobriety. I have never had that with any other program. Being in White Shield has helped me so much, it's like being home but not having all the substance abuse around me," Short said.

"There's always something going on [in White Shield]. We get to help people, volunteer at events, play basketball in adult tournaments, hit the gym, it's so cool," Yellow Wolf said.

Short agreed and said, "Volunteering here has really made a difference, it makes me feel good about myself and how I am helping elders."

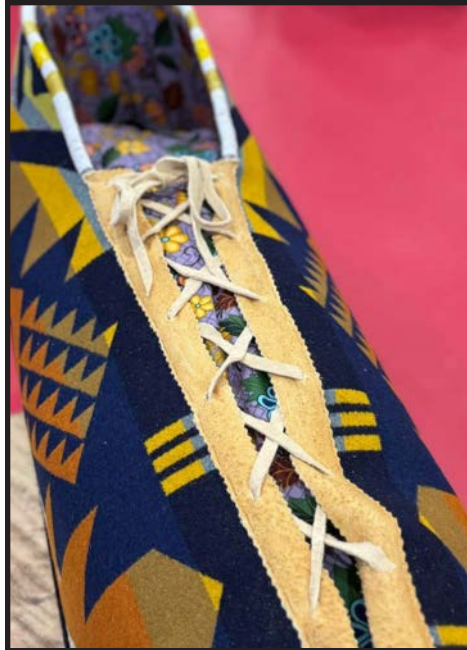

Recipe Corner

Apple Steel-Cut Oatmeal

INGREDIENTS

- 1 *tablespoon butter (optional)*
- 1 *cup steel-cut oats (certified gluten-free if necessary)*
- 3 *medium-to-large apples (I used 2 Granny Smiths and 1 Honeycrisp), cored and sliced into 1-to-2" chunks*
- 4 *cups water*
- *Pinch of salt*
- *Maple syrup or honey, to taste (optional)*

Optional toppings: swirl of nut butter (pecan butter, almond butter or peanut butter), toasted pecans or pepitas, chopped fresh apples, dried cranberries, drizzle of additional maple syrup or honey, light sprinkle of ground cinnamon.

DIRECTIONS

In a medium Dutch oven or large saucepan (around 3.5 quarts), melt the butter over medium heat (if you're not using butter, just warm the pan). Add the steel-cut oats and cook until fragrant, stirring often, about 2 minutes (this step enhances the flavor of the oats).

Add the apple chunks, water and salt. Stir to combine, and raise the heat to high to bring the mixture to a simmer. Once simmering, reduce heat to medium-low and cook for about 35 minutes, until almost all of the liquid has been absorbed and the oats are nice and creamy. Stir every five minutes in the beginning, and more frequently as time goes on (you might need to dial down the heat as well).

Remove from heat and let the oatmeal rest for 5 minutes before serving so it has more time to thicken up. Carefully taste (it's hot!) and add maple syrup or honey if you'd like sweeter oatmeal (I used tart apples, so I added 1 tablespoon).

Divide the mixture into individual bowls and serve with any toppings you'd like. If you're saving extra portions for later, let them cool to room temperature, then cover and refrigerate for up to 4 days. Leftovers reheat well in the microwave, and would likely reheat well on the stove if you add some extra water to loosen them up.

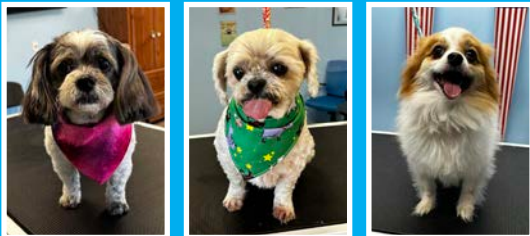
